Summary of the meeting

The workshop was attended by 100 - 120 participants, slightly more than during previous conferences. Thanks to generous funding provided by ISAG, the workshop started with an invited presentation by Laurent Frantz, which gained a lot of interest and discussions. This was followed by 5 short research presentations selected from submitted abstracts and a short business meeting.

The allotted workshop time was only 2 hours without any breaks in between. This format is possibly not optimal as there is no reserve to catch up any time during the workshop (which would be possible with a coffee break). If possible, a return to the 3 hour slots that was the previous norm at ISAG conferences until 2019 will be appreciated.



Business meeting: 2 members completed their second 4-year term and will leave the standing committee (Huson & Leeb). 2 members completed their first 4-year term and indicated their willingness to stand for re-election (Grahn & Warren). Both were re-elected by positive votes from a large majority of those being present. A call for nominations resulted in 2 nominations for new members of the Standing Committee: (1) Gabriela Rudd Garces, PhD, currently postdoctoral fellow at the University of Giessen, Germany and (2) Chesleigh Winfree-Fields, MSc, laboratory director at BioPet Laboratories. Both nominations were seconded and approved by a large majority of votes by those being present.
