Applied Genetics in Sheep and Goats Workshop

Over 100 people attended the workshop.

The Applied Genetics in Sheep and Goats workshop was held on Tuesday, July 22nd, 2008, during the 31st Conference on Animal Genetics, at Amsterdam, The Netherlands. The workshop was held from 15:30 to 17:30. The session was attended by more than 40 people with 27 people leaving contact details on the contact sheet.

The workshop program was as follows:
