

## Clare A. Gill, PhD, Texas A&M University

Clare A. Gill is executive associate dean and associate dean for research of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences at Texas A&M University. She is a professor of animal genomics in the Department of Animal Science, and her research focuses on characterizing production traits in tropically adapted beef cattle. Gill received her Honors (class I) degree as a bachelor of biotechnology from Flinders University of South Australia in 1995 and earned her PhD from the University of Adelaide in 2001.

Gill has been a member of ISAG since 1996 and has attended all but two of the society's conferences since that time. She organized the 35th ISAG conference in Salt Lake City, UT, in 2016. For the conferences in Lleida, Dublin, and Salt Lake City, she wrote NIFA-AFRI conference grants with the local organizing committees

and was awarded \$70,000 to provide travel bursaries for US graduate and postdoctoral students. Gill has served one term as an elected member of the ISAG Executive Committee.
