Summary of the meeting including votes, decisions taken and plans for future conferences

The workshop consisted of five oral presentations of 20 minutes each followed by a general discussion and committee business meeting. Each presentation was followed by questions from the audience.

- 1. Summary of the workshop presentations.
  - (i) The Chair introduced the workshop and welcomed the speakers and audience.
  - (ii) The first presentation was from the Chair (Keith Ballingall, Moredun Research Institute, UK) on the "IPD MHC database, past, present and future". The role of the immuno-polymorphism databases (IPD-MHC) (<a href="www.ebi.ac.uk/ipd/mhc">www.ebi.ac.uk/ipd/mhc</a>) in providing a curated index of alleles and the official nomenclatures at MHC loci in non-human species was presented. The importance of these databases, their origins and current applications were presented along with future funding plans for continued expansion and development. The success and support from both ISAG and the International Veterinary Immunology community through the Veterinary Immunology Committee (VIC) of IVIS was acknowledged.
  - (iii) The second presentation was from Jun-Heon Lee, (Chungnam National University, South Korea) who presented an update from the SLA nomenclature committee "The Swine Leukocyte antigen (SLA) nomenclature system, Update 2014".

- (iv) The third presentation was from Changku Park (Konkuk University, South Korea) "Allelic difference in binding affinity to the epitopes from pathogens by SLA-DQB1 and DRB1 may result in differences in post-weaning piglet survivability.
- (v) The fourth presentation was from Mairepati Palati (RIKEN Japan) who presented her data on "The characterization of MHC class II *DRB1* in native sheep from Xinjiang China.
- (vi) The final presentation was from Shin-nosuke Takeshima (RIKEN Japan) who presented his data on the "Assessment of biodiversity in Chilean cattle using the distribution of MHC class II BoLA-DRB3 allele".
- 2. The committee business meeting was attended amongst others by Keith Ballingall, (Chair), Joan Lunney (Treasurer of VIC), Chris Davies (Committee member and former Chair), Claire Rogel-Gaillard, Shin-nosuke Takeshima, and Bertrand Bed'Hom

#### **Election of new committee members**

- Keith Ballingall agreed to continue as Chair until 2016
- Shin-nosuke Takeshima, RIKEN, Japan and Bertrand Bed'Hom, INRA, France were elected to serve on the committee.
